Rotary collaborates with others for clean water

A change is taking place in the way Rotarians approach water and sanitation programs.

We realize that the challenge of meeting the Millennium Development Goals is something that no organization can achieve on its own; not even Rotary with its 33,000 clubs and over 1.2 million members. To be successful we need leverage. the leverage that comes from collaboration with others who share our goals.

The most notable example of this is the International H2O Collaboration, an alliance between Rotary International and USAID. Rotary clubs in Ghana, the Dominican Republic, and the Philippines are working together to bring safe water and sanitation to hundreds of communities and schools.

There are many other examples, less publicized but equally effective. In Uganda, a very successful relationship between World Vision and the Rotary club of Gulu is improving the lives of up to 50,000 villagers through a joint bore-hole and behavior change program. The World Vision project leader says "having local Rotarians explain the importance of hygiene and 1. handwashing is much more compelling than when presented by visiting experts from outside the country."

In Tanzania and Malawi, Rotary clubs are collaborating with Gamble to bring safe water to rural households and schools.

Bombay Mid-Town has formed a relationship with the National worked in the community for over 40 years. The institute has gained the trust of villagers, which has translated into strong support and commitment for the Rotary-led watershed development program.

The Rotary club of La Molina Vieja, Peru, supported by The Rotary Foundation, embarked on a program to help local Indian villagers build, install, operate, and maintain a biosand filter program. The program succeeded with the help of a local NGO. and technical support from the Center for

Affordable Water and Sanitation Technology in Calgary, Canada.

As water, sanitation, and hygiene programs become more complex it is unlikely that any Rotary club has the range of resources and skills to ensure a sustainable program. Success depends increasingly on collaboration with organizations having complementary resources, funding, technology, local contacts, knowledge of the culture, and expertise. Reaching out is essential if Rotary is to take its rightful place at the humanitarian table.

Incoming district governors left the 2012 International

Assembly in SanDiego, California, USA, equipped with new skills and ideas to develop stronger districts and clubs in 2012-13.

RI President-elect Sakuji Tanaka began the weeklong training event by asking the 530 governors-elect to build *Peace Through Service*.

Throughout the week, incoming district governors also participated in training sessions designed to give them the tools they need to create a stronger Rotary.

RI President Kalyan Banerjee provided

attendees with his own tips for building stronger clubs, including serving as role models and leading as equals. He explained that leadership in Rotary means giving support -- not giving orders.

"To really succeed, you have to look past yourself, past your year, and into the long term, at the health of your community and our organization," Banerjee concluded.

At the closing banquet, he encouraged district governors-elect to approach their year with peace in mind.

"All of you are leaving here as every district-governor elect should: determined to make your year in Rotary office the best year yet," Banerjee said. "You are leaving here as well with a great and noble goal: making 2012-13 a year of *Peace Through Service*."
