Be it circulars, notices or forms, KUALA LUMPUR: A delegation from the Federation of Malaysian Sri Lankan Organisations (Fomso) and Rotary International District 3300 Malaysia will travel to Sri Lanka to provide humanitarian aid worth about US\$15,236 (RM50,000) to families who are victims of the country's civil war and natural hazards.

Fomso president Datuk Kulasegaran Sabaratnam said items such as artificial limbs would be handed over to the families from tomorrow to March 26.

"This is a joint project between Fomso, Rotary Malaysia and Rotary Sri Lanka where we will give out 50 prostheses under the project namely 'Leg for Legless' Sri Lanka," he said in a press briefing at Fomso office today.
